

REPRESENTATIVE JERAMEY ANDERSON

Moss Point

A proud native of Moss Point, MS, Democrat Representative Jeramey Anderson is a beacon of hope and progress. He earned his associate degree in criminal justice from Pearl River Community College and his bachelor's degree in homeland security from the esteemed Tulane University. As the visionary founder and Chief Executive Officer of nexiWorks, a digital marketing enterprise born in 2020, he champions innovation and entrepreneurship.

Representing District 110 in the Mississippi Legislature, which encompasses Moss Point and Pascagoula, Rep. Anderson made history in November 2013 by becoming the youngest African American ever elected to a legislative body in the United States. He also holds the distinction of being the youngest individual elected to the Mississippi Legislature. Inaugurated on his 22nd birthday, he has graced the screens of MSNBC and been featured in the NAACP magazine's February issue. His voice reached audiences on the Tom Joyner Morning Show with Roland Martin, and he was spotlighted in Essence Magazine as a promising future Presidential candidate.

A sought-after speaker, Rep. Anderson has inspired graduates at numerous high school and college commencement ceremonies across the nation. He was honored as a "Young Riser" at the 2015 BET Honors, celebrated both nationally and internationally. First elected on November 5, 2013, and sworn in on December 6 of that same year, he is currently serving his third term as the District 110 State Representative, a journey that will culminate in January 2024. Following his unopposed re-election in 2019, his Democratic peers entrusted him with the chairmanship of Caucus Operations within the House Democratic leadership.

Beyond his legislative duties, Rep. Anderson plays a vital role on the Advisory Board for "Let America Vote," an organization steadfast in the fight against voter suppression in the U.S. He also co-chairs the Mississippi Future Caucus, a bipartisan coalition for lawmakers under 40. Recently, he was celebrated during the opening session of the United Nations as one of the world's most influential individuals of African descent under 40.

Throughout his legislative tenure, Rep. Anderson has passionately authored and co-authored significant legislation aimed at enhancing minimum wage, ensuring full funding for public education, promoting wage equality, reforming the criminal justice system, and expanding childcare subsidies. He embarked on his legislative journey to inspire his generation,

demonstrating that they can achieve anything they set their minds to. Representative Anderson currently serves on the following committees:
